#### A. Treasurer's Report

#### B. APWA Golf Outing

APWA allowed us 5 minutes (+/-) at their annual conference held 11/2-11/4/16 to promote our organization to their membership and other attendees. M. Hahm also performed the "rain thing" group exercise.

#### C. FEMA 273 Course, September 19-23, 2016

S. Wurster gave a huge kudos to WEM and WDNR for assisting with this week-long course, which was held in Ruekert-Mielke conference center in Waukesha, WI. There were approximately 30 attendees for the course, and approximately 10 people took the CFM exam. Because the CFM was held at that time, it was not offered at the WAFSCM fall conference. D. Fowler suggested that WAFSCM host the 273 course and CFM exam on a regular basis in lieu of the refresher course and CFM exam at the fall conference. ASFPM no longer allows WAFSCM to host the CFM refresher course that was regularly offered in the past at our fall conference.

The Board collectively gave the organization a score of 5.5 out of 10, identifying our strengths and weaknesses as follows: Strengths-Putting on a great conference, educating our members on technical topics, and promoting social activities. Weaknesses-We struggle with membership participation across the state and recruiting new members. The focus for 2017 will be to improve the organization's impact.
